## PERFORMANCE NOTES:

This is a setting of the Responsorial Psalm for Christmas Mass at Night (Midnight Mass), but may be used at any of the liturgies of Christmas Eve or Christmas Day.

It is best to perform this piece as follows:

The Refrain is played through once by the organist/pianist as an introduction.

The Cantor sings the Refrain once with accompaniment to intone it for the Assembly.

All sing the Refrain together with the Cantor and accompaniment.

The Cantor sings the verses alone with accompaniment.

After each verse, all sing the Refrain twice with accompaniment.

In addition to the music provided here, parts for String Quartet are also available for this piece.
